River Wnion - Dolegllau



Morris Ford selects a fly for the night ahead

On Saturday September 3rd, I met up with Dolgellau Angling Accociation Club Bailiff Morris Ford, on the River Wnion, near Dolgellau, North Wales.

Today's Flyfisher commissed me to report on the Wnion (a tributary of the River Mawddach) following reports of it's sewin catches.

Unfortunetely, the nearby Mawddach was polluted back in 1984, when over 2000 adult Salmon and Sea Trout smolts were killed. An out of court settlement between the local Gwynfynydd Gold mine and what was Welsh Water (now the EA) resulted in a trust fund being set-up. The money was then used to build a hatchery to re-generate the Mawddach and Wnion, which has proved a great success.

On the night though, Morris only managed to catch one small school fish of about ¾lb, but nevertheless, it proved a worth while, interesting visit. For just £65 a year, you can become a member of Dolgellau AA and have access to some thirteen miles of prime sea-trout fishing on the Mawddach and Wnion. Also, as a bonus, you can fish the nearby 20-acre 'Llyn Cynwch' lake, which is regularly stocked with both rainbows and browns. Bargain! The hatchery investment is certainly beginning to pay dividends.

I saw at least a dozen good sized sewin the next morning looking over one of the nearby iron bridges. It's certainly food for thought – I can only dream of a simular hatchery being set-up to re-generate our River Loughor.
