Although we haven't seen great numbers of Sewin of late, it's encouraging to see the number of Salmon that are being caught, both on the Loughor and from our Lampeter stretch on the Teifi.

According to the anglers, the water was just a bit too high and only a few small trout were caught. Nevertheless, fishing should improve during the next week or so. As you will see, according to the catch reports, it's well worth a late season visit to Lampeter.

### Float Tubing

How do you fancy being in the middle of a lake, sat inside an inflatable tube, wearing chest waders and a pair of flippers? Well, this is what I tried recently on a lake in North Wales.

It's something that I've always wanted to try, and I must admit, it exceeded all my expectations and it proved an excellent, fun day out. Being able to access 100% on the lake, and catch fish just yards in front of you, this really is my kind of fishing! I'd recommend a day's float tubing to anyone. Unfortunately, many lakes don't allow this form of fishing – only a select few lakes in North Wales allow float tubing. I'm keen to start a local 'Float-tubing club', in the hope of encouraging the use of tubes and helping the method become more acceptable.
